# SPORTS RESULTS

## Cricket

### Girls U15A v Stonyhurst (A) Lost

On Tuesday the girls travelled to Stonyhurst for a T20 cup match. Sedbergh won the toss and elected to field. The game started well with the girls bowling some tight overs and it was Tilly who picked up the opening wicket and find the breakthrough. Stonyhurst ran well between the wickets and picked up lots of singles to keep their runs ticking over and some little errors in the field meant Stonyhurst managed a score of 117.

Opening the batting was Bella and Flo who wanted a good start and get off the mark. A couple of singles got us started but an early wicket ended the partnership. More wickets fell and the girls were under some pressure. Emilia and Daisy put on a score and tried to reduce the run rate as much as they could. A couple more wickets fell and it was a big ask for the girls to take the win. A valiant effort but dropping short on 102 meant Stonyhurst took the win.

Some key learnings taken away for the girls.

### Boys U15B v Sedgwick CC (A) Won by 18 Runs

The U15s secured a victory in their opening game of the season vs a spirited Sedgwick side. A lightning opening partnership from Teddy D & George B saw us race away at over 11 runs per over.

However, once both openers had been dismissed, runs were harder to come by, but were bolstered by a quick fire 13 from Tobias and a solid knock from Wilf W to help us achieve a final total of 120 all out, in this limited over contest.

Tight bowling and sharp fielding were required on this postage stamp sized pitch, and this was duly delivered by Tobias. Although he had no wickets to show for it, his restriction of the run rate created palpable pressure on the Sedgwick team.

He was ably supported by Harry W, Ben B, George B & Wilf W, who took a man of the match performance with 4-12 of his 4 overs, which included a hat-trick to dismiss Sedgwick for 102 all out in reply.

### Girls U14A v Burneside CC (A) Lost

The girls bowled first on a chilly evening at Burneside Cricket Club on Tuesday evening. Anri the most consistent bowler on the day with 3 overs for 16, Bronte taking 1 for 16 also.

Millie looked in good form with the bat before a mix up resulted in her being run out. Sasha scored 13 and Tilly top scored with 18 but we couldn't keep up with the required rate. Not the result we wanted but a performance that the girls can take some confidence from going into the next game.

### Boys U18A v Lancaster RGS (A) Won

It was a good week for the Boys 1st XI, it started with a trip to local rivals RGS Lancaster in the National T20 cup. Bowling first Lancaster made a quick start before a tight spell of bowling from Freddie and 3 wickets from Raman kept the score to 140 at the break. Will hit 31 of 26 balls to get the chase off to a positive start and Harry kept up the tempo with some positive running between the wickets scoring 23 off 15 ball. Henry and Charlie won the game with 3 balls to spare with a composed 33 run partnership. Myerscough College to follow in the North West semi final.



### **Girls U17A v Appleby U16 (A) Won by 6 wickets**

The U17 girls headed to Appleby for the first of their mixed league games. Poppy and Matilda opened to bowling for us and immediately put Appleby under pressure. Matilda finished with figures of 3 for 7 after her 4 overs, and in the middle overs Mariella bowled 4 overs going for just 5 runs. Appleby set 96 in their 20 overs and Sedbergh knew that staying in for a long period of time would do the job. The girls were disciplined facing some quick bowlers, Mariella scoring 30 not out and Lydia contributing 26. A comfortable win in the end for the girls.

### **Boys U18A v Rossall School (A) Won by 7 runs**

Friday night saw the boys travel to Rossall for a T20 game, Sedbergh batted first and after a slow start George (55) and Oscar (33 off 15) had a free-flowing partnership to reach a total of 156 in 20 overs.

Charlie started the second innings taking 2 wickets for 14 runs in 4 overs to get Rossall behind the rate early on. George took a wicket in his first game, a stumping by fellow debutant Lucas who performed well behind the stumps in a close game. A 4th wicket stand of 87 gave the hosts a chance going into the last over but captain Athwal held his nerve to complete the win.

### **Boys U15A v Cumbria U15 (H)**

We lost the toss and got put into ball on a good wicket at home. We didn't start to well with the ball as Cumbria were 50-1 after the first 6 overs of our T20 game. The middle overs were brought back into our favour with our spinners getting the run rate under control again and then with Henry picking up 3 wickets to have Cumbria finish their innings on 129-8 in 20 overs.

We started well with the bat despite losing an early wicket. We were 84-2 after 10 overs, but then our middle order collapse began again with us being 89-6 after 13 before bad light and rain forced us to abandon our game.

### **Boys U18A v Merchiston Castle School & St Peter's York (H) Won**

Saturday saw the 100-ball game being played at Sedbergh as we took on Merchiston and St Peter's. Batting first Merchiston hit 116 in their 100 balls, Jamie was the pick of the bowlers only conceding 9 runs from his 20 balls. Sedbergh didn't really get going in the reply, always just behind the run rate it looked like we had left too much to do needing 11 off the last set of 5 balls.

A single with the first ball left Harry on strike, he clipped the next ball for 6 into the pavilion and followed it up with a 4 over midwicket to win the game with 2 balls to spare. Another close game that the boys got over the line in the last over.

Jamie bowled another tight spell to help restrict St Peter's to 101/4 off their 100 balls. Seb also bowled a good spell in only his 2nd game but the highlight were two stunning catches. Taylor diving full stretch to his right to dismiss the opening batter would usually have had the best catch of the game, Rocco Cockcroft then went one better sprinting in 30 meters before another full length dive catching the ball inches from the ground.

The chase was relatively drama free and it looked like the a comfortable chase, 37 from 27 balls from Will the pick of the batters. With only 4 needed to win and 24 balls to get them the game should have been a formality, then came a St Peter's hat-trick to throw a spanner in the works. Normality resumed in the next set and the 5 wicket win was finally achieved with 16 balls to spare, the end of a busy but successful week.

## **Boys U15A v Merchiston Castle School & St Peter's York (H)**

Vs Merchiston

Our first 100 ball game last Saturday was a great way to start our triangular against Merchiston and St Peter's York.

We won the toss and bowled first against Merchiston and had them 11-3 inside the first 25 balls. Due to drop catches and bad fielding spells we let them get to 73-9 in 100 balls. Our openers Freddie (27 off 15 balls) and Lucas (29 off 10) started our innings with a bang, chasing 74 runs to win in 25 balls. Sedbergh winning by 10 wickets.

Vs St Peter's York

We lost the toss and bowled first again. We started with getting a wicket first ball of the game with George bowling their opening batsman. After this great start, we bowled too short, dropped a few catches, and let in too many boundaries for St Peter's. They ended on 110-9 in their 100 balls.

We never started well with built up pressure by too many dot balls which resulted in us giving away wickets at regular intervals. Ted (20 off 23 balls) and George (23 off 24 balls) were our standout batters. We only managed to get 76-9 in 100 balls, losing by 35 runs.

## **Boys U14A v Merchiston Castle School & St Peter's York (H)**

The toss was won by Sedbergh in the first game, and Captain Teddy chose to Bat first. A strong start by openers Monty and Captain Daly was followed on by a strong batting performance by Henry, to scoring with 36 not out. Sedbergh managed to get through their 100 balls scoring 143 for Sevens wickets.

In reply Merchiston started rather slowly and that man Henry, continued his good form with a fine piece of bowling and finishing on 5 wickets for 18, with fellow seam bowler Erasmus getting 3 wickets for 13. Merchiston restricted to scoring just 89 runs all out. Sedbergh winning by 54 runs.

Daly started brightly but was run out by fellow opener Monty after a mix up on a single run.
