Sedbergh were put into bat by St Peter's on an excellent Cemetery wicket. Although Sedbergh lost captain Bella C early, Lara H and Flo H steadied the ship, with Lara in particular building a good innings of 19 runs. Minnie R accelerated the innings with some outstanding striking scoring 27 from 14 balls. She was ably assisted later in the innings by Lottie B who scored a run-a-ball 15.

Sedbergh knew their total of 135 put them in a strong position but that they would have to bowl economically and, in particular, restrict the number of extras bowled. Minnie continued her strong performance with excellent figures of 1-12 from her 4 overs. Freya W-R was again extremely consistent and went for only 15 runs from her 4 overs. Whilst St Peter's had some strong batters, Sedbergh took wickets at key times as Minnie trapped the St Peter's captain lbw, Bella took a sharp catch off Freya and Minnie completed a smart run-out with a direct hit.

U15 Girls v St Peter's

A gloriously hot afternoon on Akay saw the U15 girls once again demonstrate their talent and fortitude in producing a complete team performance. Captain Barker won the toss and elected to Bowl first. Leading from the front with figures for 13-1 from her 4 overs. She was supported brilliantly in the field by the whole team. Lyle behind the stumps continues to improve every game while the fielding of Harrison and Askew was superb. Wickets were hard to come by with the St Peter's opener scoring well but not quickly. Renison 24-1 and Mycielska 24-0 were both reliable while Halsall bowled two excellent overs for just 11 with Scott contributing too.

140 on the board looked a good score. However, Barker and Mycielska started well taking the score to 60 before Mycielska fell. After losing Renison quickly Harrison joined Barker and the innings accelerated. Their aggressive stroke play and running between the wickets quickly took the game away from Peter's. However T.Bellamy's opening partner, F.Westmoreland got stuck in and scored 65 runs off 56 balls. Stand out batting performances followed by T.Follett (27) & B.Scarff (16 N/O) leaving St Peter's a target of 174.

The bowling started well with St Peter's opening pair being reduced to a combined total of 5 runs, and an out of this world catch at slip by C.Calvert; After the game the opposition coach said "it's the best catch he's seen in a second team game". Wickets continued to fall thanks to excellent bowling performances from O.Ridley (1 Wicket), T.Follett (3), F.Westmoreland (3 & a catch) and an unbelievable bowling spell from E.Ball who's bowling stats finished up with 3 overs, 2 maidens, 2 runs, 3 wickets.
