Boys U18A v The King's School, Macclesfield (H) Won 55 - 5

The stage was set for an emotional final outing for Sedbergh, though not quite in the way originally planned. Horrendous weather conditions forced a last-minute change of venue, with the fixture relocated to the 4G pitch at Kendal Rugby Club. Despite the upheaval, the team's focus remained unwavering — a bonus-point win was needed to keep their Daily Mail Trophy hopes alive, but above all, it was their final chance to wear the brown jersey together, a moment they deeply cherished.

If the disruption unsettled them, it never showed. From the first whistle, Sedbergh burst into action with an attacking fluency that looked effortless. Their connections across the pitch — built through months of shared work, challenge, and commitment — were on full display. Every carry, every support line, and every phase reflected a team completely in sync, playing with confidence and purpose.

The early tries arrived quickly, fuelled by fast ball and relentless tempo. The forwards dominated the gain line, providing a platform that allowed the backs to express themselves with pace and precision. Sedbergh's accuracy in execution left King's Macclesfield struggling to contain the movement and variety of their attack. Defensively, they were equally impressive, showing organisation and physicality while allowing very few opportunities for their opponents to build momentum.

The bonus point was secured well before the interval, but Sedbergh played far beyond the necessities of the scoreboard. This performance was driven by pride in the jersey and a desire to finish their season — and for many, their school careers — with a display that embodied who they had become as a team.

The second half followed the same pattern: intensity, clarity, and a collective belief in how they wanted to play. King's Macclesfield battled bravely and earned a deserved try, but Sedbergh's control of the game remained absolute. The closing stages provided a fitting farewell for the Upper Sixth, who soaked up their final moments in brown, surrounded by teammates who have shared in their journey.

The result was emphatic, but the performance held far greater meaning. It was a testament to resilience, adaptability, and the strength of their team identity.

A period of defence work then followed before the deadlock was broken by Scarborough with a try close to the Sedbergh posts, but their kicker missed the conversion. Sedbergh quickly replied with a powerful carry and try by Jody D. Henry C who had a superb day with both ball in and off the tee scored the conversion. The game continued in this fashion until the scores were 12-12 with two minutes to half time. A injury to a Scarborough player ended the half early with Sedbergh on the attack.

An extended half time break due to the injury meant another short warm up for both sides. Sedbergh came out of the blocks Henry C and Adam H left Sedbergh leading 26-12 with 12 minutes to play. Scarborough were however not finished and scored a converted try to make the score 26-19.
