#### Cricket

##### Girls U18A v Barnard Castle School (H) Won by 8 wickets

On Monday our 1st team cricket girls took on Barnard Castle in the first round of the 100 Ball National Cup. Sedbergh were on top from the start and managed to have Barnard Castle 38 for 8. However, a good partnership saw Barnard post 66 all out in their innings. Sedbergh had a slow start with the bat, being 11 for 2 with both openers out. Freyja and Harriet came in and steadied the ship, scoring 32 and 20 respectively. This partnership secured the win by 8 wickets, with 45 balls left.

##### Boys U15A v Altrincham Grammar School (H) Lost

Sedbergh won the toss and chose to bowl first in their national cup fixture against Altrincham Grammar School. Tobias and Ashton each took 2 wickets, debutant Ed playing a year up was the pick of the bowlers with 1 wicket for 27 off his 8 overs. Altrincham reached 270 with one of their batsman scoring 145 not out.

Sedbergh's captain Charlie scored 95, George scored 51, Ed scored 21\* and Matthew scored 19 however Sedbergh were bowled out for 253 fall short of Altrincham's score.

##### Boys U18B T15 First Round (H)

Sedbergh hosted the group stages of the T15 tournament. The first round saw us comfortably beat Kings Macclesfield. Will smashed 95 with the bat and Fred was deadly with the ball taking 4 wickets including a hatrick.

In the second round Sedbergh beat RGS Lancaster. Will scored 51, Fred H and Fred G-S taking 3 wickets each.

This means Sedbergh are through to the finals, to be held later this month.

##### Girls U15A Indoor Northern Final (A) 4th Place

Having won the Cumbria Indoor tournament, our U15 girls got the chance to play the North Regional Finals at Headingley Stadium. Winning the first game and losing the second, the girls headed into the last group game needing a win to progress into the semi-finals. The girls struggled with the bat and only managed to post 33 in their innings.

Knowing what was on the line, Poppy, Minnie and Bella were on fire with the ball and bowled out the opposition for 9 runs, securing a top 4 spot. A much better batting performance in the Semi saw us post 73 off our 8 overs. The Sedbergh girls looked on top for majority of the second innings, however GSAL managed to ramp up the scoring and won the game on the last ball. A great top 4 finish in the North Regionals for the girls.

##### Girls U18A v Eden Eagles (H) Won by 19 Runs

Thursday saw the annual clash of our 1st XI girls against Eden Eagles. Put into bat first the Sedbergh girls looked to build a mature and well-timed innings. Violet opened and set the tone for the team with an excellent 43 of 46 balls. Having shown that there were runs to be made the rest of the top 6 followed suit as the girls posted 128 for 4 off their 20 overs. The Eagles lost an Early wicket to the bowling of Lileah but managed to build a big partnership for the 2nd wicket. Looking on top of things, the Eagles lost a 2nd wicket to Imogen, who bowled fantastically, taking 2 for 15 in her 4 overs. The tides swung after this and Sedbergh managed to restrict Eden Eagles to 109. Sedbergh winning by 19 runs.
